

Political Studies Association Contributions and Editorial Policy – PSA Blog

The PSA welcomes contributions from academics or research students in political studies and related disciplines based in the UK or internationally. We do, on occasion, also publish work from outside academia including from policymakers, those in industry, charities or research organisations.

Submissions should be between 600-1000 words in length and include a title of no more than 10 words, a two-sentence opening standfirst and a short biography of the author (including any social media profiles they might have).

Submissions should be free of jargon, suitable for a wide audience and should use hyperlinks rather than references or footnotes.

Photographs, graphs, tables infographics etc can be included where appropriate, but the author must be the rightful owner of this material.

Submissions will be edited for:

- Presentation, length and style (see above)
- Spelling and grammatical errors (we use The Economist's style guide)
- The addition of links to relevant websites
- Organisation and flow
- Amendments to the title
- Removal of jargon and specialist terminology

The PSA will not change the substantive content of any submission.

Substantial edits will be referred back to the author for approval before publication. For topical pieces, a response may be required within 24 hours.

The PSA reserves the right not to publish any submission it receives.
