

Richard Rose Prize

This prize is awarded to a younger scholar who has made a distinctive contribution to the study of British politics (including Northern Ireland), through the publication of books and articles.



Anyone aged under 40 on will be eligible for nomination. A nominee does not have to live in the UK, but should be a member of the Political Studies Association. A nomination may be made by a Head of Department or by any member of the Association.

The prize will be awarded at the following Political Studies Association's annual conference dinner.

Winners of the prize in previous years have been Dr. Claire Annesley (University of Manchester), Professor Colin Hay (University of Sheffield), Dr Eric Kaufmann (Birkbeck College, London), Dr Andrew Denham (University of Nottingham), Dr Meg Russell (University College, London), Dr Matthew Flinders (University of Sheffield), and Professor Philip Cowley (University of Nottingham).

Rules

- Nominations must be made on the relevant form.
- CV of nominee is required
- One-page statement by nominator summarising achievements of the candidate in relation to the prize and identifying most important publications is also required
- Copies of up to three journal articles, book chapters or book table of contents relevant to the work of the nominee can be included.
