Members of the YPP specialist group engage with key issues, such as citizenship, citizenship education, political socialisation, Votes at 16, electoral participation, political generations, non-electoral participation, Do-It-Ourselves politics, protest, generational replacement, intergenerational inequalities, precarity and politics, engagement, and representation.
